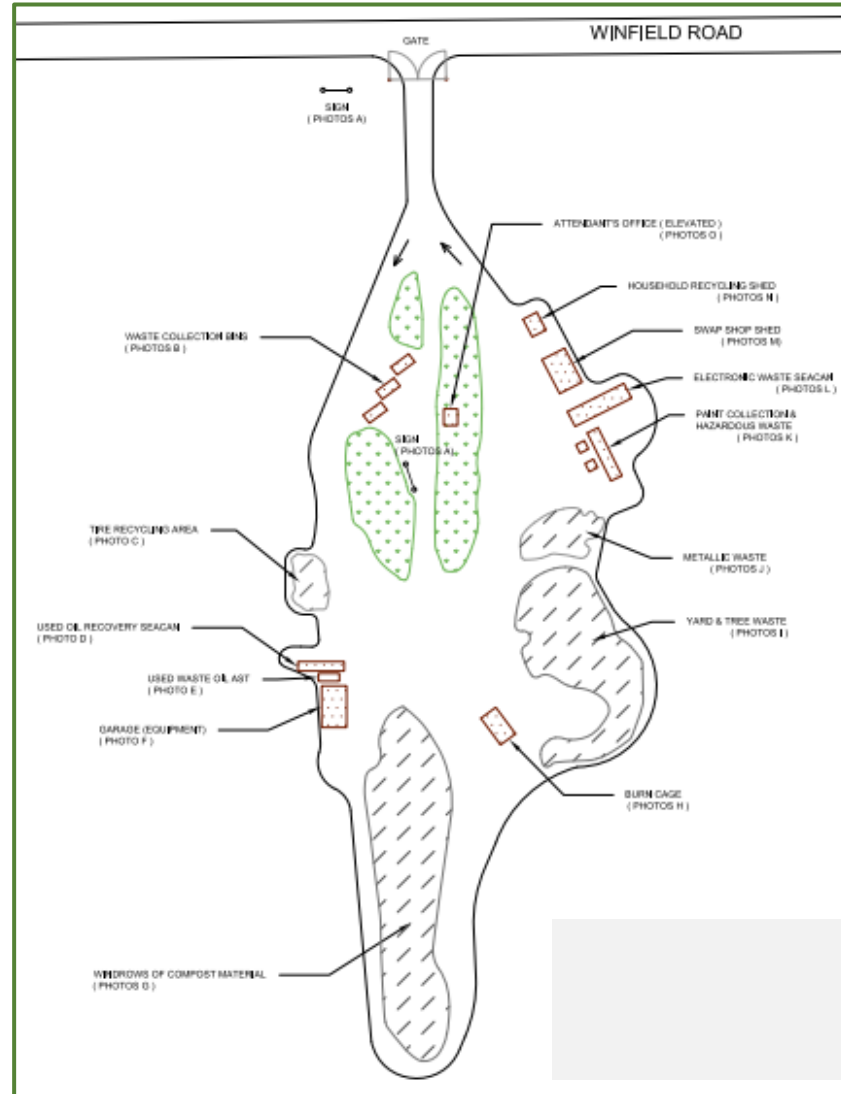

Checklist 1 – The Basics

Community Name: _____

1. What kind of road access does your community have?

- Our community is accessible by all weather road
- Our community is accessible by winter road only
- Are there seasonal road restrictions that affect hauling in/out of your community?

2. How is waste collected in your community?

- Waste is picked up from households in the community
- Community members are required to haul their waste to our disposal site
- Waste is collected from community businesses and offices, schools, other buildings
- Businesses, offices, schools, other buildings are required to haul their waste to our disposal site
- It's a mix. Some get their waste collected. Others are required to haul their own

3. Where is the solid waste from your community disposed?

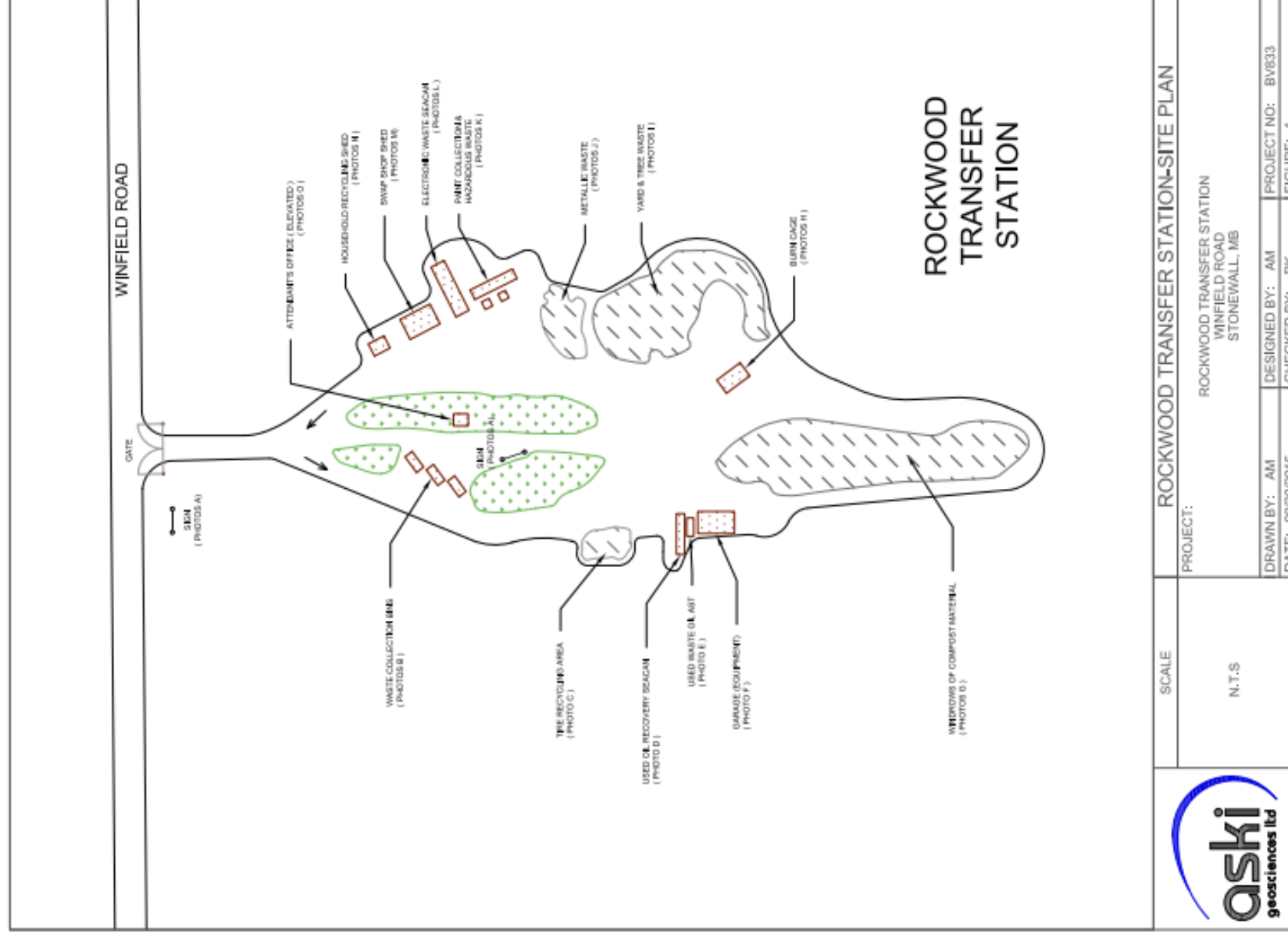
- We operate our own waste disposal site in our community
