

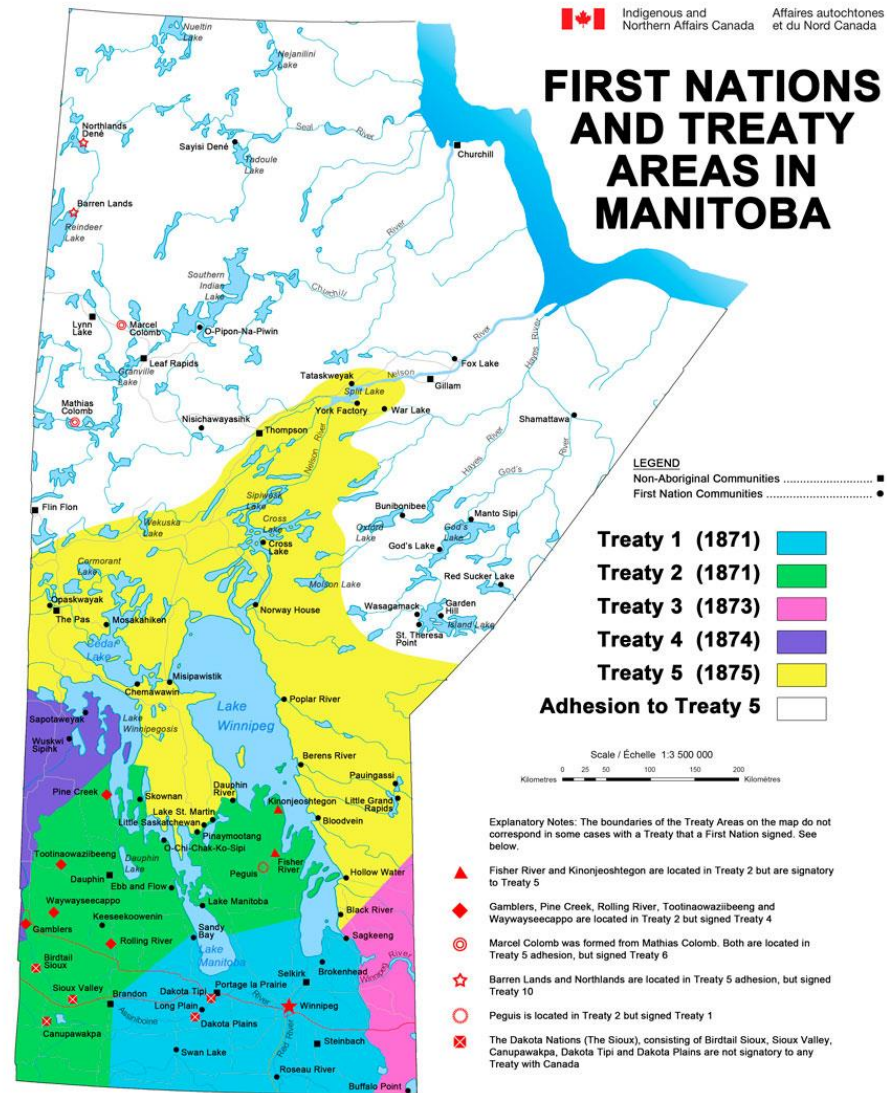


Welcomes you to the...

Brad Saluk, *Vice-President*

Reeve, RM of Brokenhead

Brad is currently serving his third term as Reeve for the RM of Brokenhead. His political career started when the Town of Beausejour called a by-election in 2005, and Brad decided to run for the position of councillor. He won. In 2006 he ran for re-election and won his seat back to become Deputy Mayor. In the years following he worked hard for the people of Beausejour and in the 2010 election became Mayor.

Brad was born and raised in the RM of Brokenhead and attended school in Beausejour. After graduating, Brad decided to work with his family on the farm, side by side with his father and his brother, and in the year 2000 he took over full control of the farming operation. With his brother Randy, wife Nancy, and son Justin they continue to run the family farm.

Brad was elected to the AMM Board of Directors in June 2015 and Vice-President in November 2018.



Honourable Tracy Schmidt, MLA for Rossmere Minister of Environment and Climate Change

Tracy Schmidt was elected as the MLA for Rossmere in 2023. She is a lawyer with a background in labour and employment law.

Prior to becoming an MLA, Schmidt worked as a labour relations officer for the Winnipeg Association of Public Services Officers. She also spent a decade working for Canada Post, where she was an active union member. Schmidt holds a bachelor's degree in sociology and criminal justice from the University of Winnipeg and a law degree from the University of Manitoba, where she won the outstanding graduating student award in 2019. She has held board positions with the Manitoba Association for Rights and Liberties and the Community Unemployed Help Centre.
